A Pastor's Pondering

It is nearly impossible to open a news channel, webpage, facebook feed, or newspaper without reading/hearing about the flu epidemic that has hit southern California, and the city of Riverside in particular. I don't know the exact statistic but it seems like the flu shot was only 10% effective against the different strains of flu that were prevalent last fall into this winter. A number of deaths have even occurred as a result of the flu this year. Medical professionals urge the public to stay away from those affected by the flu and to practice good hand washing habits.

This seems like a good metaphor for faith and the Christian life, especially if you substitute the word "sin" for "flu" and "church" for "flu shot":

It is nearly impossible to open a news channel, webpage, facebook feed, or newspaper without reading/hearing about the <u>sin</u> epidemic that has hit southern California, and the city of Riverside in particular. I don't know the exact statistic but it seems like the <u>church</u> [is] only 10% effective against the different [types] of <u>sin</u> that were prevalent last fall into this winter. A number of deaths have even occurred as a result of <u>sin</u> this year. <u>Religious</u> professionals urge the public to stay away from those affected by <u>sin</u> and to practice good <u>hand washing</u> habits.

I think the metaphor is creative and appropriate however, I was struggling to find the faith correlation to hand washing. What practice could replace hand washing to finish off this metaphor well? Would it be immersing ourselves in scripture? Maybe the equivalent would be prayer? Maybe the answer is Jesus (since in most church environments the Jesus answer seems to work often)? Maybe the parallel to hand washing is more personal and might look different from person to person?

Whatever you decide the correlation to hand washing is for you, practice it often.

A Minister's Musings

On Saturday February 24th, MagPres hosted 120 people from our Presbytery for the annual leadership event. As Pastors, Paul and I were very proud of our MagPres people as they served an amazing breakfast and guided people around our church campus. It was a great day! Our speaker Tod Bolsinger spoke about how church has changed in the last 50 years, which makes it imperative that the church change as well, no matter how painful or difficult. He also spoke about every church having its own DNA, its own core values that can inform how we go about moving forward. A church's DNA can be as simple as, "We are a family" or "We are friendly". The trick though is to ask the question, "What does that look like? What does that mean? How does that determine how we do ministry?" For example we might ask the question "Are we friendly to those just within our church membership? Are we friendly to visitors? Are we friendly to those in our community? Do we take our friendliness one step further and become a friend? How can friendliness become an agent of change within a church?"

These are some of the ideas that were discussed in the breakout session, "Continuing the Conversation". Exploring MagPres' DNA is just one of the ideas that we will be working on in the near future. Pastor Paul and I hope you will go on this journey with us.

Deacon's Corner

About this time, when the number of disciples was continually increasing, the Greeks complained that in the daily distribution of food the Hebrew widows were being given preferential treatment. The twelve summoned the whole body of the disciples together and said, "It is not right that we should have to neglect preaching the Word of God in order to look after the accounts. You, our brothers, must look round and pick out from your number seven men of good reputation who are both practical and spiritually-minded and we will put them in charge of this matter. Then we shall devote ourselves whole-heartedly to prayer and the ministry of the Word." Acts 6:1-4

Ever wonder who the first Deacons of God's church were? The above passage states that originally 7 were first chosen to fulfill this responsibility. The passage continues and names the 7 in charge of this important duty. Much like that of the early church, Magnolia also has a Board of Deacons that is a ministry of compassion. The board is currently comprised of 14 deacons and Pastor Claire. The board is similar to session in that we have a moderator, treasurer and secretary. It is broken down into many subgroups performing different tasks for the membership. However, the primary focus of the deacons are to care for people in need.


We will be taking signups after both services in March. If enough people are interested, the seminar will be scheduled.
