# **A Minister's Musings**

Examine me, God! Look to my heart! Put me to the test! Know my anxious thoughts! Look to see if there is any idolatrous way in me, then lead me on the eternal path!" Psalm 139 23-24

Spring is here! I love spring! As I write this it is the Monday of Holy Week and the road to Golgotha looms ahead juxtaposed against the warm air, blue skies, flowers blooming that I see outside my window. It is hard to not jump ahead to Easter with weather like this. And so I'm wrestling with the irony of thinking about the crucifixion when everything seems so alive! That being said I am also struck by the fact that sometimes in order for something to bloom; often something has to die or at least be pruned. As I want this week to be one of reflection I have to ask myself, "What in me needs to be pruned or die altogether before I can bloom into what God intends for me?"

This last weekend Pastor Paul and I spent time at camp with our youth and the theme of the weekend was "Refresh." Part of the discussion was about how we can refresh our faith through spiritual disciplines like praying the psalms, or tapping into our emotions through music or journaling. As I sat there at camp journaling, following the instruction to just let our minds go and write, things came up that I realized I needed to let go of. Even more than that, I realized I wanted to let it go. Sometimes refreshing our faith or our minds is as simple as saying, "oh well..." or can be as deep as confession. I have discovered that letting an attitude or grudge go and choosing to replace it with praise, thanks, and forgiveness is very freeing and sure way to joy and peace. So here is a question for us all, "This Easter season, what is keeping you from the joy that God intends for you and what are you willing to surrender?"

# A Pastor's Ponderings

Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed!

The most significant of the Christian Holy-days occurs on April 1st of this year, but it is not April Fools Day. It is Easter. Easter is the celebration of central event of the story of our salvation. Easter is when the church proclaims the good news that is at the heart of the gospel: that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. Jesus' resurrection was and is a decisive, ultimate victory over sin and death. That is a lot to celebrate while also playing practical jokes, pranks, and spreading hoaxes too. If only we could give Easter more attention. In the church, we do.

Did you know that in the liturgical/Church calendar, Easter is not just a day, it is a season?

According to our denominational website, "One day out of 365 is hardly sufficient to celebrate the great mystery of our faith—that Christ is risen from the dead. Accordingly, the season of Easter lasts seven weeks, spanning the fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday." While Lent is a 40 day period of prayer, fasting, reflection, and self examination, Easter is a 50 day season of celebration and rejoicing.

"Of course, Easter really isn't just a *season* either. In the fullest sense, Easter is a new way of life in which we are "dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:11), called to "walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:4). Every year, for fifty days, the church celebrates and rehearses this new way of life in the Season of Easter — as we await its completion in the fullness of Christ's reign."

May we live as Easter people, celebrating and rejoicing, not just in word, but also in our actions.
