Book Study!


You've heard of Henri Nouwen. You wonder about what spirituality really is.

I hope the same for you. But did you know that re-creating doesn't have to wait until summer. It doesn't even require traveling or taking

time off from work. Re-creation can occur in simple practices: when we spend time with our family, when we gaze up at the stars (or that fantastic blood moon last month), when we pause each day to give thanks to God for another day, and when we read God's word.

Roles and Responsibilities (as stated in the Standing Rules of Session):

1. Careful management of, and ongoing maintenance and upkeep of the church's facilities

2. Provide human resources to open, manage, and close the facilities for church and community functions and events so that the overall mission of the church will be met

3. Review insurance, building maintenance contracts, landscape and equipment contracts (including obtaining property and liability insurance to protect our facilities, programs, staff, and elected and appointed officers (G-3.0113))

4. Administer facility use requests (in coordination with the office)

5. Coordinate and communicate with other individuals, groups, or committees of the church, as needed, to accomplish its work

6. Consult with Session regarding major renovations, building projects, property sales, and purchases and work with other committees to develop plans for future facility needs

7. Maintain an inventory of all church furniture and equipment and maintain a preferred vendor list for repairs and maintenance

8. Develop an annual committee budget, in coordination with the Stewardship and Finance Committee, and manage committee budget on a monthly basis

9. Oversee other funds related to its work, in conjunction with the Stewardship and Finance committee

10. Act as liaison with governmental agencies, rental, and lease groups


In other words, anything and everything having to do with the Buildings and Grounds on the campus which is MagPres, this committee takes care of it all!!





Combined Endowment Funds – Spotlight on Those Who Made Them Possible

In last month's Uplook, we listed four endowment funds that have recently been created by combining funds. This month, and for the next three issues, we will spotlight those who originally set up the funds that made this possible. Their foresight and generosity continue to bless our church.

This month, our focus is on the endowment funds that make up the "Magnolia Presbyterian Church Where Most Needed" category. The following information is printed below as it was originally submitted by the donor(s) from our Endowment Registry Notebook, which is kept in the church office, and maintained and updated by the Endowment Committee for all of our funds.

Dr. Charles and Irene Coggins

Charles (Charlie) and Irene Coggins were born and raised in the Tar Heel State of North Carolina. Charlie grew up in the textile community of Cherryville and Irene in the town of Clayton, in the tobacco region of the state. Charlie was the eldest of six children. He developed an early interest in the things that grow in the ground. After high school he enrolled at North

Carolina State University in Raleigh and proceeded to earn the BS degree in Agronomy and sequentially the MS degree in the same subject. While working on the Masters Degree, Charlie met Irene, at that time working



at Nationwide Insurance Company in the city of Raleigh. They married, and before the degree was conferred their first son arrived. The desire to further his study under a particular professor drew Charlie and Irene to California and the University of California, Davis. There Charlie earned his PhD in Plant Physiology, aided by a well deserved National Science Pre-Doctoral Fellowship. After receiving his doctorate, Charlie was hired by the University of California, Riverside. Except for a brief ten-month sojourn with the USDA in Washington D.C., Charlie has spent his entire career in Riverside at the University. He retired from the institution in 1994, but has over the years returned for various reasons, on a part-time basis. At UCR Charlie achieved national recognition and acclaim for his many contributions to the world of citrus. Among the many awards he received was the Albert G. Salter Memorial Award presented in 2003 by the California Citrus Quality Council, in which was stated: "His research on plant growth regulators has been described as the single most economically beneficial research result of the last century." Since joining Magnolia Presbyterian Church, Charlie and Irene have been active in a wide variety of ways. Irene has served on various committees and Charlie, an ordained Elder and Deacon, has filled the role of Clerk of Session. The couple enjoy reading, bridge, and travel. Charlie has been Chairman of the Board of California Citrus Quality Council and a member of the Board of the California State Citrus Park in Riverside. The couple have two sons.

<u>Helen Lanman</u>

Helen Lanman's Endowment Fund was set up in 1999. Helen resided at the Community Convalescent Hospital on Jurupa Avenue in Riverside. She passed away on October 30, 1998. Her interment was at Olivewood Cemetery in Riverside.

Pauline Florenz Weber Love (on left in photo) Mrs. Love came to Riverside from Titusville, Pennsylvania, as one of the Weber sisters. Pauline's support for Magnolia Church included serving as an elder, teaching the Lotta Weber Bible Class after her

sister's death, participating in the Women's Association, serving as Treasurer, and encouraging pastors and



church leaders through her positive, strong faith. She married late in life and had no other family in California when she was widowed in the early 1950s. Former Pastor Leonard Osbrink reminisced about her encouraging girls to be "proper young ladies." He noted that she worked quietly behind the scenes and "always spoke up for the pastor." Another friend remembered her as a "slender, erect, proper lady who was always interested in Magnolia church." Pauline was a strong advocate for the church's tithing program and the church school. She had an up-beat attitude that lasted even when she was confined to her home. When she broke her ankle at 88 years of age, the doctor said she was healing like a sixteen year old.

Helen Wallace



Helen joined Magnolia Presbyterian Church as menber #1865 on February 24, 1963. Her parents were also members of the church. She lived behind the church on Potomac and enjoyed walking to worship services on Sunday mornings. Some members might also remember her

driving a 1960 green and white Rambler from time to time. Helen was founder of the church's Telecare outreach program that lasted from 1972 to 1999. In addition to her devotion to church work, Helen was also very devoted to other causes as well. On numerous occasions, she went door to door collecting money for the American Heart Association. The City of Riverside honored Helen in 1984 for her Volunteerism. Helen Wallace died on December 17, 1997, at the age of 98, and was the oldest member of the church at that time. She had been a member of Magnolia for 34 years and had been dearly loved and respected by everyone in the congregation.

Homer and Olive Watson

Homer and Olive Watson's journey to Riverside started when as teenagers they met in the Hemet Presbyterian Church – also the home church of David Dillworth, who later served as a pastor at Magnolia Presbyterian in the early 1950's. In fact, Olive's widowed mother rented a home from David's father and helped pick the apricots and walnuts on his farm. Olive, as a teenager, helped David with Vacation Bible School. Homer, a native of Chester, Nebraska, arrived in Hemet, California, from Sioux City, Iowa, in 1934, at age 16 - and later was in charge of Christian Endeavor, a church youth group. It was in this group that Homer pursued a friendship with Olive. Olive was born in Fannin County, Texas, and as a child learned about Jesus through a neighborhood children's group taught by her aunt. They walked to church together. After her father died, her mother and

family arrived in Holtville, California, near Yuma, in 1936, lived also in El Centro, then moved to Hemet when Olive was a teenager. Homer and Olive were married on July 27, 1941. They started their family after Homer was drafted into the US Army in 1943. In the meantime his parents moved from Hemet to Riverside; and when Homer was discharged from the Army, he and Olive followed his parents there. Homer supported his family working for the City of Riverside for 12 1/2 years with machinery, carpentry, and plumbing. One day on the job, he had to be rescued from being buried underground, had an ear cut off, plus a broken hand, and was 3 months and 10 days in recovery. He transferred to the Riverside County Road Department and worked for another 22 years. During this time, Olive was a full-time mother and a lovely homemaker. Homer and Olive were blessed with five children: Larry,

Sharon, Mike, Janet and Jerry. They attended the Palm Baptist Church until 1973, when they decided to become a part of the Magnolia Presbyterian Church. This was soon after Robert Byrd had become pastor and the completion of a new sanctuary. Both Homer and Olive became active



members of Mariners, a fellowship group for couples. Homer served two terms as an Elder on Session where he found his calling in the Administrative Committee (now called the Outreach and Operations Committee). Solutions to many needs were solved as the Committee learned to "just call Homer". He spent many days taking care of God's House and its surroundings. Olive was active in the Women's Association, a group of 40-50 women who met for potluck lunch, Bible study, and gave to missions through the Least Coin Offering. She served as Vice President and then led them as President for four years. Olive also ministered for three years as a Deacon. A few years after his death on December 1, 2001, Olive and her family wanted to honor Homer with something that would last. They chose to establish this endowment to be used where most needed in the church. Olive concluded, "Dad would have been happy with the ongoing help."
