🖵 very two years, the highest governing

body of our denomination gathers to accomplish the work assigned to it and to cast a vision for our denomination, for at least the next two years, but often more.

At this year's General Assembly, with our very own Cherylyn Thornton in attendance, representing Riverside Presbytery as a Commissioner, a number of actions, statements, and decisions were made. Many are joy-filled because of these actions, while many are concerned and challenged. Perhaps the action that was deemed most controversial was a motion to declare that "the PC(USA) recognize the laws, policies and practices of the Israeli government regarding the Palestinian people fulfill the international legal definition of apartheid." Some of my colleagues take issue with this action, believing it damages interfaith relations, especially with some of our Jewish siblings. Others of my colleagues embraced this action, believing it is a faithful witness to people who are being treated inhumanely and unjustly.

As my colleagues discussed their disagreement on this particular action, I was heartened to witness and experience civil discourse. Too often,



I experience disagreements that devolve into heated and hurtful exchanges.

As Presbyterians, one of our Historic Principles of Church Order (F-3.0105) is Mutual Forbear ance. Now forbearance is not a word I encounter

regularly (it is in our Book of Order and I think I saw it in loan paperwork), but it's a word that can be helpful in our further dividing world. It means: "to bear with or put up with each other when we are most divided." Even when we disagree, we set our disagreement aside to remain together and do what God is calling us to do. An example of this is a quote from the actor Robert Mitchum.

"A reporter once asked him to share the secret of the success of his marriage of more than thirty years an unheard-of tenure in the divorce-friendly Hollywood culture. Mitchum's answer was,

'Mutual forbearance. We have each continued to believe the other will do better tomorrow.' The film star's marital credo recalls the old bumper-sticker slogan: "Be patient: God isn't finished with me yet." (Carlos Wilton, *Principles of Presbyterian Polity*).

We Presbyterians, at our core, are uniquely positioned to participate in and change the divisive world we live in because of our historic principle: Mutual Forbearance. But how well are we expressing this principle today?

To take effect, the proposed change needs approval from a majority of the presbyteries. Immigration. The assembly voted 340-25 to declare the PC(USA) a "sanctuary and accompaniment church" — saying the denomination stands with immigrants and asylum-seekers and is committed to working for justice in U.S. immigration policy. That work often involves Presbyterians accompanying immigration hearings and other appointments and trying to get people released from detention.	Restructuring. Supporting recommendations from a special committee, the assembly voted to create a commission with the power to act and the responsibility for unifying the PMA and the Office of the General Assembly — basically, to restructure the top level of the PC(USA). Citing financial stress on congregations and presbyteries, the assembly also created a team to develop experimental models as alternatives to the current per capita funding system. Reproductive justice. In the wake of the U.S. Supreme Court decision overturning Roe v. Wade, the assembly approved a resolution on reproductive justice — saying the PC(USA) rejects "attempts at all levels of government to reduce, limit, or eliminate access to contraceptive and abortion care."	 LGBTQIA+ equity. The assembly created a new LGBTQIA+ Equity Advocacy Committee as a permanent committee of the General Assembly — equivalent in access and accountability to the Advocacy Committee for Women and Gender Justice and the Racial Equity Advocacy Committee. Per capita. The assembly set the new General Assembly per capita assessment at \$9.85 per member for 2023 and \$9.80 per member for 2024. That compares to the current per capita rate of \$8.98 per member. 2024 General Assembly. Presented with four options, the assembly opted for a hybrid approach again for the 2024 assembly — choosing Plan Omega with online committee meetings and in-person plenary sessions in Salt Lake City. Urah.
Now that the 2022 General Assembly has ended - the first-ever hybrid assembly - the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) will try to live into the commitments made and the work ahead. Ruth Santana-Grace and Shavon Starling-Louis, the new co-moderators, stood for election using the theme "Unbounded We Thrive," and the assembly spoke its mind on issues affecting the church and the word.	Israel/Palestine. The assembly voted 266-116 to approve one of the most controversial items before it — INT-02, declaring that the PC(USA) recognize the laws, policies and practices of the Israeli government regarding the Palestinian people "fulfill the international legal definition of apartheid." Some have criticized the PC(USA) stance towards Israel as antisemitic, saying it hurts interfaith relations. Others say the assembly spoke courageously in supporting human rights for the Palestinian people.		Committee focused exclusively on issues of race and gender justice — including violence against Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, disparities experienced by Black women and girls, and racial disparities in health care. Other concerns: confronting White supremacy in the PC(USA) and working for reparative justice. Gun violence. With recent mass shootings still echoing, the assembly approved VIOL-07, declaring 2022-2032 a "Decade to End Gun Violence" — asking the Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) to develop tools for faith-based advocacy against gun violence and for studying "the intersection of white supremacy culture, Christian nationalism, and gender with gun violence." It also approved VIOL-11,






SUNDAY SCHOOL for children in grades Kindergarten through 5th grade is offered In-Person and via Zoom during our 10:00 a.m. worship service.
