#### FROM THE CO-PASTORS

Lately around the office, we've been thinking and talking about the big C word, and the word is not "crisis." The word we've been talking about is Church. With news media airing video interviews and quoting MagPres leaders and members in their articles, there was a reminder that the church is not a building, it is the people. In addition to this reminder your pastors have reflected on the manifestation of the (big C) Church that we experienced in the midst of this crisis.

Too often, churches operate in competition with each other, trying to get more members/attenders, creating the next innovation in worship, and offering something more meaningful and "better" than other churches. But on December 23rd and in the days following, came the reminder that we are not in competition, but are a part of the same team: the Church of Jesus Christ.

Churches in our tradition and Presbytery immediately reached out in support, offering space and resources (these include Calvary Presbyterian and Victoria Presbyterian) as well as pastors throughout our presbytery. Even local churches and pastors from outside of our tradition offered their support: First Congregational, All Saints Episcopal, First United Methodist, Hope Lutheran, Eden Lutheran, Trinity Riverside, First Christian Riverside, the Riverside Community Center for Spiritual Living, and more. The larger churches in Riverside offered support as well, including The Grove, Harvest, and Sandals. Harvest even sent two of their pastors onto campus to offer their assistance and in response to a request, provided over a hundred battery operated candles and paper bags that became luminarias that helped light our parking lot and walkways on Christmas Eve. The support of those who worship Jesus Christ here in Riverside was overwhelming and we have nothing but gratitude.

While those on the rolls at Magnolia Presbyterian Church number 229 people, the (big C) Church of Jesus Christ here in Riverside, of which Magnolia Presbyterian Church is a part, is formidable, diverse, and making a significant impact in Riverside.

When we gather for worship on Sundays at 9am and 11am, may we remember that we are just one expression of the (big C) Church of Jesus Christ, that we have siblings in Christ that gather all throughout the city, and even though our expressions are different, we all worship and serve the same Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

May these words bring hope and peace to you in this new year,
