As I move into a new year I can't think of a better way to make some changes-dare I use the word "resolution"?

## More from Stewardship

Just what is Per Capita??? Per Capita giving is a method of funding some of the essential functions of the Church (PCUSA), both on a local and national level. Per capita is divided up on a percentage between our Presbytery (local), Synod (Synod of Southern California and Hawaii) and General Assembly (national). One of the ways the members and churches of the Presbytery stay connected to one another is through the per capita apportionment giving.


**The Per Capita for 2017 is \$35.00** *per* member (both adults and children who are members) to fund the support structure of our denomination that allows us to be in ministry together. Magnolia is responsible for the annual Per Capita for every member of our church. However, when members are able to pay their individual Per Capita of \$35.00, it reduces the amount that must be paid out of the church budget.

If you would like, and are able, please submit your check in the envelope marked "Per Capita Apportionment" in the front of your envelope box for 2017 and place it in the offering plate on Sunday or send it by mail to the church office. Also, please mark on the check "Per Capita Apportionment."

Also in the front of your 2017 envelope box is an envelope labeled "Initial Offering." A \$3.00 donation in this envelope will help defray the cost of the 2017 envelope boxes.

Thank you for supporting Magnolia's 2017 budget with Per Capita giving and defraying the cost of the envelope boxes.

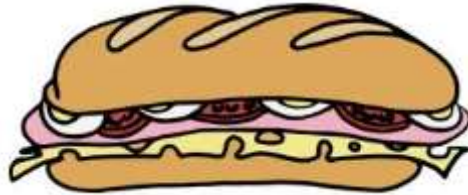


## **Lenten Growth Groups**
