I look forward to doing this with you.



STEWARDSHIP NOTES

Per Capita - what's that?

If you haven't already, you should be receiving your offering envelopes in the mail. One of the first envelopes is labeled "Per Capita Apportionment." Do you know what those words mean? Per the denominational website (https://oga.pcusa.org/section/ecclesial-and-ecumenical-ministries/per-capita/frequently-asked-questions/):



"Per capita is an opportunity for all communicant members of the Presbyterian church through the governing bodies [mid councils] to participate equally, responsibly, and interdependently by sharing the cost of coordination and evaluation of mission; and of performing ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions that identify a Reformed Church, while at the same time strengthening the sense of community among all Presbyterians"

In essence: Per capita is a set amount of money (apportionment) per member that congregations pay to the larger Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Said another way, it is a Presbyterian Covenant Community Fund — part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. Because every Presbyterian shares in the benefit of the PC(USA)'s system of government, the expenses associated with coordinating and performing the functions of that system should be shared by everyone as well.

Our Presbytery offers the following information:

Per capita is how we share the expenses of the PC(USA) system of local, regional, and overall government without reducing mission dollars. Each PC(USA) congregation is a part of a Presbytery, Synod, and the General Assembly and pays per capita based on the number of members reported in a previous year. The **2022 per capita** in the Presbytery of Riverside is **\$36.00 per member**, which is the same as last year (no adjustment):

Presbytery of Riverside: \$24.17 Synod of SoCal & Hawaii: \$2.85 Office of General Assembly: \$8.98 Total: \$36.00

We encourage each member to contribute their portion of per capita as they are able. Since it is per member, a family with 2 adults and 2 member teenagers would contribute a total of $36 \times 4 = 144$. If you can contribute a few more dollars when you offer your per capita, you can help the congregation offset the cost for those individuals or families who are not able to pay the entire amount. Mark your donation or use the special envelopes provided. Being connected is part of being Presbyterian. Thank you for all you do to keep us connected to each other.

Lollipop Valentine Cookies



INGREDIENTS

12 Craft Sticks

1/2 Cup semi-sweet chocolate

1/2 Cup Butter, softened

1/3 Cup light brown sugar

1/2 Tsp vanilla extract

1 Egg

3 drops of red food coloring

2 Cups all-purpose flour

1/4 Cup unsweetened coco

1/4 Tsp salt

12 (1 ounce) white chocolate

1 Egg

1 1/4 Cups confections suga

Soak craft sticks for one hour in a bowl of cold water. In a small heavy sauce pan over very low heat, stir chocolate chips until melted and smooth. Remove from heat; let cool. In a large bowl with electric mixer at medium speed, beat butter, brown sugar and vanilla until fluffy. Beat egg in well; beat in cooled chocolate. With mixer at low speed, beat in flour, cocoa powder and salt until smooth. Divide dough in half. Preheat oven to 375 degrees and grease 2 large cookie sheets. Roll each half out to 1/8 inch thickness between 2 sheets of wax paper; freeze, in wax paper 5 minutes. Peal top sheets of wax paper off dough; cut dough out using 3 inch heart shaped cutter. Reroll scraps; freeze again for 5 min; cut out. Place half of the hearts 1 inch apart on prepared cookie sheet. Drain sticks, pat dry. Place one stick on each heart to make 2 1/2 inch handle, pressing lightly into dough. Place remaining hearts on top; press edges gently to seal. Bake about 12 minutes until firm to touch. Cool on wire racks. In 2qt saucepan over very low heat, or in top of double boiler set over barley simmering water, stir white milk chocolate until melted and smooth; if using both chocolates, melt separately. Remove from heat. Holding lollipop by handle, dip into chocolate to coat on both sides; let excess chocolate drip into pan. Place each lollipop as it is coated on wax paper; refrigerate 20 minutes until chocolate is set. To make icing: in large bowl with electric mixer at high speed, beat egg white and confectioners sugar until very smooth. If desired, remove small portion of icing to separate bowl; tint with drops of food coloring. Spoon icing into decorating bag fitted with small writing tip; pipe over lollipop in desired pattern, have fun with it! Let dry and enjoy.


