As we begin a new year together, I wanted to take a moment and say, "Thank you." Thank you for choosing to be in ministry with Pastor Claire and me. Along with a "thank you," I wanted to encourage you also.

Over the last seven months, many of you have created space for my family and me: allowing us to sit in your row (in Michelle's case in the choir loft), listening to our stories and sharing your own, inviting us to participate in MagPres events and even asking for feedback as to how we could do things better. What we experienced was the opportunity to be ourselves and to be integrated as part of the MagPres community and sometimes you let things go to include us. Sometimes it might mean letting go of something in order to include them.

As we enter a new year, what will you do to make space for others? With anticipation, I look forward to seeing your responses in action.

November Financial Report:

The November 2017 Treasurer's report indicates an income of \$344,981.35 and \$364,794.28 in expenses. The result is a current negative balance of \$-19,812.93 for the month of October. This is not good news. However, if we consider the \$16,983.08 of endowment interest and \$8,266.50 of deficit reduction funds that were budgeted to meet expected shortfalls, our adjusted balance for November is \$5,436.65.
