
2021 - Begins the Listening Group

What is it?

Answer: A group of people listening individually, at their own pace, to personally hear God, then interacting with the group as they feel comfortable for support and fellowship.

What does it cost?

Answer: No money involved. God's word is 100% benefit.



Is the group using a specific translation of the Bible?

Answer: You can use whichever version you would like. We have a link for an audio feed and CDs for the NIV Version with dramatized production, but you can select another version is you'd prefer. The CDs can be provided to you, or you can access through the YouTube link, or both.

How does the group communicate with one another?

Answer: First we should pray for one another as we progress through this blessed journey. We have a blog set up so that people can communicate by typing messages at any time. If a phone, Zoom or in person discussion develops, all the better, but we'll make that happen as the group wishes. We're family; sisters and brothers in Christ, we can communicate however and whenever is appropriate.

Why should someone do this?

Answer: This is a question appropriately asked and answered between you and your Creator. No teaching is going to happen here. No-one is in between you and God. No-one is here to tell you what is right and what is wrong, or what you should believe. We should all go into this with the faith that God will handle the communication and God's Will will be done with each of us.

Why is it being done in this manner?

Answer: To better your relationship with your Creator, Lord and Savior. The Bible is the greatest book ever compiled. The contents have been written down by numerous authors over thousands of years with virtually uncountable events and inputs combining to form the Bible. It is Divinely inspired so that combined, in the blessed order, each person who listens to it in its entirety can hear God being revealed for the purpose of a personal relationship between Creator and the uniquely created. (that's you!) Listening for the purpose of communication and relationship with God will be very different than considering The Bible for study, reference or its individual stories.


