Pastor's Pondering

Towards the end 2019, some of the MagPres staff and I received the dreaded anonymous letter. It was typed and printed but there was no name, no date, and nothing in the letter to indicate who authored the letter. I instructed the staff who received this letter to toss it, preferably putting it in the recycle bin.

Any book on leadership, particularly leadership in the church, tells us that anonymous communication is less than ideal. The advice that these books give is to simply ignore anonymous communication. I don't know where I heard this from, but I often repeat it: "Every Church seems to have the same 3 people in them: Some R. Hearing, cousin of Somefolks R. Saying, both of whom are friends with Ann Onymous."

Pastor Claire and I have been working on and continue to move MagPres towards healthier practices, one of which is ignoring anonymous



communication. But here's the thing, I want to know what you think, good or bad, about things happening in the church, city, and/ or world, and I want to

hear it from you. I want to know your opinion is because you matter.

FIRE COMMITTEE UPDATE, As read in church, December 2019

Good morning everyone and thank you for your prayers and patience with the process of the aftermath of the fire.

The Fire Contracts Committee wants to share with all of you the progress that has been made recently. As a reminder, in May we selected our contractor, CA Construc-



tion. We also selected TR Design Group of Riverside as our architect and we brought that to you in August, the last time I spoke with you. We have been waiting for the undisputed amount to be settled with the insurance company in order to sign with our architect. We were really hoping to have an update in this regard and say we had an executed contract with the architect but we are awaiting the insurance company as of today.

In October, the Insurance company sent a substantial check for the part of the claim that was undisputed. We have received several payouts thus far, totaling over 1.45 million dollars. This includes the contents claim, half of the organ replacement value, extra expense payouts (meaning improvements to this space), payments to several subcontractors, and the undisputed amount to date of nearly \$1 million. In October we were assigned a new general adjuster at the insurance company and things seem to be moving along at a better pace.

Soft demolition within the sanctuary has been completed as of the end of October. If you are wondering, soft demolition means all of the stuff not part of the "contents", which had already been removed, so building pieces that are removable and don't impact significant structure.

Even though this building we are now sitting in was not damaged in the





In this next episode, we welcome Zach Gipson, David King and Kristine Shea as they begin their first terms, Jay Nicholson, serving his 3rd term, Dick Kirby, his 4th, and Deanna Cohen, fulfilling a two-year unexpired term. Read on to find out more about our newest Elders:

Zachary Gipson is serving his first term on Session and has been attending Magnolia for 5 years, member for 1½ years. He was born and raised in Kansas City, Kansas.
