## **Pastor's Pondering**



It has been over a month now that we have been given safer-at-home guidelines or, as many of us have been referring to it, in quarantine. Your church leaders and staff have been committed to two things over this last month: 1) providing meaningful worship experiences and 2) caring for you in the midst of this pandemic. I want to offer my thoughts about the first priority: providing a meaningful worship experience.

One of the principles that informs how I plan worship comes from Leonard Sweet in his book, *Post-Modern Pilgrims: First Century Passion for the 21st Century World.* Sweet uses the acronym EPIC to describe a model of doing church: **E**xperiential, **P**articipatory, **I**mage-driven, and **C**onnective. When we are gathered together in person for worship, I have a pretty clear picture of how to make our worship experiences EPIC. But now that we are online only, this "clear picture" has become slightly opaque. To make the most out of our worship experiences online, I offer the following suggestions (adapted from an article by Scott Shepherd, posted at: <a href="https://baptistandreflector.org/how-to-worship-online-suggestions-for-church-members/">https://baptistandreflector.org/how-to-worship-online-suggestions-for-church-members/</a>):

**Prepare**. Take time to prepare the space where you and your household will gather for worship. Make sure everyone has a good view and that you are able to connect via our website (magpres.com/watch) or our Facebook page (facebook.com/magpres).

**Focus.** Give attention to the online service—just as you try to do in a normal church worship gathering. (Try not to surf Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter. Don't use the time to make your shopping list. Use the bathroom before the service starts.) Be present.

**Read.** Bring your Bible, whether you use a print or digital version. When the Scriptures are read, read and follow along (even though the scripture text is available on the screen).

**Write/Draw.** Staying focused during a 15-minute *live* sermon can be difficult. Being attentive while you watch online can be even harder. Find ways to engage physically, even during the sermon. Take notes, draw pictures about the Scripture passage and the sermon. Invite children to do the same. Be creative!

## **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

By the time you receive this Uplook, your Session will have held two Called Meetings and two Stated Session meetings via Zoom virtual meeting format. This has been a pretty smooth transition for most, even for those of us in the more technically-challenged genre. These meetings follow Robert's Rules of Order and Presbytery's important principle of the opportunity for "simultaneous aural"



communication between all participating members." In other words, Session members need to be able to hear everyone else and have opportunities to discuss motions and ideas before voting.

Some of the items discussed/voted upon have been:

- Transition to on-line blended worship with music staff involved
- ⊕ Setting up of on-line giving
- ⊕ Compensate all employees on their average work-week salary
- ⊕ Communication with tenants using our campus; waiving rent for a month for some
- ♣ Asking Deacons not to meet in person
- ₱ Pairing an Elder with a Deacon to double calls to flocks
- ♣ Approval of virtual prayer/ support groups following on-line Sunday services
- ♣ Approval of virtual Communion on Maundy Thursday
- Designation of Elder Dick Kirby to be on-site construction manager for the sanctuary rebuild
- ⊕ Continuance of sack-lunch feeding program if volunteers agree to be involved

Some of these decisions have been harder than others and there may be more needed to be made at future meetings, yet Elders are careful to listen as they make decisions and continue to show grace and patience and love.

# **Minister's Musing**

Today a memory popped up on my Facebook feed, "3 years ago today..." Yep it's been three years since Paul and I were installed as Co-Pastors at MagPres. I mentioned to him this morning that sometimes it

seems like we have done 20 years of ministry in these 3 short years. Who would have thought three years ago we would have had to maneuver a Sanctuary catching fire and a global pandemic! And while these have certainly been challenging situations, I am also reflecting on the joys and highlights of our ministry as Co-Pastors like leading worship together, brainstorming new ideas, opening up our church to be more inclusive, our 9 months leading the Youth Group and going to camp with them, going down a massive waterslide for a bribe to raise money for mission, accompanying youth to Triennium, practical jokes, and all the other crazy things Pastor Paul ropes me into.

You all have been there right alongside us with your energy, imagination, and love, being

open to trying new ways of doing things like the Session going through "Rooted" and exploring a new "groups" model for the church, starting video worship and now online worship. We restored our stained-glass windows in the worship center just in time to use it once again as a full-time worship space and it even has new chairs, flooring, AC and decent heat now! We have ended each of these 3 years in the black financially, spearheaded Family Promise of Riverside, and opened up our campus to Milestones Preschool and EEEAC, a Hispanic congregation.

What will the next 3 years bring? Who knows? My hope is that we will have a new Sanctuary, new members, deeper faith, and a fuller knowledge and understanding of who God is in each of our lives, and what God is calling us to be and do here at MagPres. I am grateful beyond words for Pastor Paul and for each one of you and your partnership in the Kin-dom of God. May God continue to bless each one of you.

**Sing.** When the hymns and worship songs are sung, sing loud and proud. Sing loud enough that your neighbors will hear and wonder what you are doing. It could be an opportunity for evangelism.

**Pray.** Echo the prayers offered online worship leaders, including the unison prayers with words available on the screen. Pray a prayer as a household before the service starts. Pray again after the service ends.

**Move.** Worship is more engaging when we use the bodies God has given us. Don't be afraid to engage in the biblical actions of physical worship. Clap, raise your hands, stand up, sit down, bow down...or dance! Whatever it takes to stay engaged! No one will see you anyway.

**Give.** Giving tithes and offerings is an important act of worship...even when we can't pass the offering plate. Consider giving prior to, during, or

following the online worship experience. You can give online at <u>magpres.com/give</u>. You can also give through your bank's bill pay service. And you can always mail in a physical check to the office (Magnolia Presbyterian Church, 7200 Magnolia Ave. Riverside, CA 92504).

**Debrief.** After the service is over, take a few minutes to discuss the service. What did God reveal to each household member through the service? What are some adjustments can you make for the next online worship experience to make it more meaningful?

Worshiping online has been different, but we can still make it EPIC. Consider using these suggestions above as we worship together moving forward!

## **Crop Hunger Walk March 15, 2020**

Congratulations to Magnolia Presbyterian Church donors, sponsors, and walkers for raising \$3,050 for this year's CROP Hunger Walk. Yes, we came in first place again and had the most walkers(19) on March 15<sup>th</sup> after church. This year we walked around the neighborhood of Magnolia Presbyterian Church, led by Cherylyn Thornton who kept us informed about our neighborhood growth. It was a time to celebrate what our church can do when we come together to help others in need. The total funds raised this year by all the participating churches in Riverside was \$13,210. Of that 25% goes to our local organizations that focus primarily on feeding and care of those in need in Riverside. While 75% of your support will go towards families in 55 countries, including the U.S., that work to overcome hunger, poverty, disaster, and displacement.
