Rather, you will receive power after the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.—Acts 1:8

One morning last week during my quiet time with God, a few questions began swirling around in my brain; "What if a church could be the place where you could be your authentic self; the place where you could grow into your best self; where you could become the person God designed you to be and others could help and support you along the way; a place where you felt accepted no matter what and could do all of that without judgement?" Nothing really revelatory I don't think, but maybe a continuation of some thoughts that Pastor Paul and I preached about a few weeks ago regarding what it takes to have a healthy and authentic church. I posted it on Facebook and received 45 likes and numerous comments.

One of the comments was from a good friend of mine who I have known since college. Her comment went something like "While reading scripture and prayer are important practices, we often fail to meet people in their pain, to get alongside them, to love them through the problem to the other side. They wind up feeling judged, or disinclined to share their vulnerabilities..." the other aspect of this is who do we conscious-

ly or subconsciously consider less than? Who are those we feel uncomfortable around? Are we open to have someone who looks or acts different be a part of Magnolia? This is what *koinonia*-that is "deep relationships" and inclusive table fellowship mean.

I have been a part of a church for most of my life, except for a few years of rebellion after High School, and I have seen the church at its best and at its worst. One thing I think we have a tendency to do is automatically say "That's not us!-we don't do that here" and dismiss it as irrelevant. Reflecting on what we can do better individually and as a congregation is an important part of being the church. And yet we don't really talk about this much let alone put it in the church newsletter.

If we as the church are to be a beacon of

love, light, and reconciliation to the world and can't figure out how to have meaningful relationships in the church with Jesus as



our guide, how can we expect to model that to the world? There is a phrase that goes, "more of you God, less of me." May that be our prayer at Magnolia and unto the uttermost parts of the earth. -

"But now, says the Lord...I have called you by name; you are mine." Isaiah 43:1

As I continue to transition into my role as Co-Pastor alongside Pastor Claire, a primary focus area for me is people's names. Many of us have been wearing our name tags in worship, and I am very grateful for that. A number of us introduce ourselves with our names (i.e., "Good morning, I am ______") which is also helpful. And as we begin worship each week, Pastor Claire and I have included our names as part of our welcome.

Nothing makes a person feel more included than when people know your name. Remember the song from the TV show Cheers:

Sometimes you want to go,
Where everybody knows your name,
and they're always glad you came.
You wanna be where you can see,
our troubles are all the same
You wanna be where everybody knows Your name.



Names are significant in the Bible:

- •-Adam names the first woman Eve
- •-God renames Abram and Sarai to Abraham and Sarah
- •-God gives Jacob a new name: Israel
- •-Moses asks for God's Name

and those are just a few examples from the first two books of the Bible.

April Financial Report:

The April 2017 Treasurer's report indicates an income of \$126,421.82 and \$126,262.60 in expenses. The result is a current negative balance of \$159.22 for the month of April. This is good news. Additional, if we consider the \$5,209.00 of endowment interest and \$3,006.00 of deficit reduction funds of that were budgeted to meet expected shortfalls, our adjusted balance for April is \$8,374.22.

Reminder: Per Capita (method of funding some of the essential functions of the Church both locally and nationally) for 2017 is \$35.00 per church member.
