Hello Everyone, Thank you for your prayers and patience with the

process of the aftermath of the fire. The team of four has continued to meet and communicate regularly to go over all of the steps required. The members of this committee are Ann Laudermilk, Tom Safford, Tim Lewis, and I (Erin Gettis).

Our mission is to be the very best stewards of our Church resources and to make sure that the Church has those resources in place to move forward with the path once chosen. There have not yet been decisions on whether to rebuild what was there, build something new, or a hybrid of the two. The timing of that decision is closer, but not yet decided. Either path though requires us to get the best most accurate bid possible to insure that the settlement is the best possible. Our insurance company provided a single bid to do the reconstruction of the church and we were left to collect additional bids. Due to our desire to be the very best stewards of this Church and the



"..."choose life..." Deuteronomy 30:19



During the last month, I got a new (to me) trumpet. It is different from any previous horn I have owned. It has a dark, full, and round sound. It is solid and pleasing to the eye. Minister's Musings Rev. Claire Schlegel

Look! I'm doing a new thing; now it sprouts up; don't you recognize it? I'm making a way in the desert, paths in the wilderness.

Isaiah 43:19

As I'm writing this, in exactly three weeks I will be on my way to Greece and London for vacation. I'm looking forward to going to a place I've never been before (Greece) and returning to a place (London) I visited 20 years ago. As I think about going to the new place, I wonder what it will be like and it if it will live up to my expectations. There is a certain amount of nervousness involved in going to a new place even though I am traveling with a group of people whom I know pretty well. However, as with any travel experience with people, the stress involved in travel has the potential of not bringing out the best in others.

On the other hand, one could say that London is more familiar and comfortable even though it's been awhile. Questions that come to mind as I think about that are, "What has changed there?" and the bigger question for me, since the last time I went I was still married, "What emotions will be stirred up?" I ask these questions because I am aware that even though it is a place I've been, the chances of it being the same are highly unlikely. I am in a different place in my life and London has also moved on so to speak.

Both of these examples bring up questions, "How do we move forward? Should we move forward? Should we go back? Can we go back?" Maybe other questions are "Do I want to be comfortable? Or do I want to risk? What is the reason for trying something new?" And yes, you have probably guessed it, I am no longer talking about my trip. These are questions all of us need to ponder as we think about the direction for MagPres. We have the opportunity to have our worship space reflect where we envision ourselves going in the future. Those are the questions our Session and congregation will be asking in the next few months. May God guide us in this time of discernment.

In Christ. Pastor Claire congregation's resources we chose to collect additional bids, some were forwarded to us by the insurance company and some were companies that we found through our network in our community of the Inland Empire. We had a total of five contractor teams that visited the site and four (including the one from the insurance company) chose to bid.

From those bids, there was clearly one contractor that rose to the top as one that had our church's best interests in mind based on the depth to which they ensured all aspects of the existing church before the fire were included in the bid. We will be meeting with this contractor this coming week to clarify a few items on the bid before we announce to the session and the congregation. Once selected this contractor will work with us as a partner in all necessary items needed to move forward and to coordinate with the insurance company. This contractor has insurance and fire experience, they are a company founded on this type of work.

Further update on the church building itself, while it appears as if little has happened from the outside, a lot has happened on the inside. We also have moved forward on the pews. The restoration needed to the pews from the fire, smoke and water damage cost as much as purchasing new pews so we have chosen to settle for that amount and dispose of the pews. The settlement will be reserved for the future seating needs of the new sanctuary. All of the contents of the inside of the church have been removed and catalogued by a demo contractor. We are now working with a 3rd party on the contents claim and determining the value of the contents. We will be contacting some of you to solicit knowledge and more specificity on the contents list so we can be the best stewards of the church resources while working on the claim.

As part of this process, there have also been improvements to the existing church space (called the Fellowship hall or the 1880s sanctuary we are sitting right now) which has been conducted by various church committees and members of the Building and Grounds Committee. There is improved lighting in the church, new TV screens, new chairs and at the moment we are reviewing bids for new HVAC to this building. We are also moving along through the permitting process for the temporary ramp, moving closer to that permit being granted and the ramp installed.

We continue to ask for your prayers for all of us working on this process, for the tough decisions facing us in the future and the continued challenges that will continue to arise. Every week presents new things to consider. Thank you very much for your time.


The church will be purchasing hymnals to be used in the Worship Center. We are offering the opportunity to donate to the
