Deacon's Corner

Got Health?

When you ask someone a question like "How are you doing?" or "How are you feeling?", what kind of answer are you expecting?

Most people, me included, assume you are asking about their health, or most recent ailment, whether diagnosed by their doctors or by WebMD.

Personally, when I am asked, I assume the individual is asking me about my multiple sclerosis, but for others the answer could range anywhere from a common cold to something more severe, such as a heart issue or cancer. But what would you do if the person said to you, "Physically I am ok, but I'm struggling with a mental health issue"? Would you freeze and say the proverbial, "I'll pray for you", or would you run to the nearest pastor or deacon screaming HELP?

Why is this? Does the idea of a person having a mental health challenge or diagnosis scare you? Did you know that, according to the National Institute of Mental Health, one out of five adults in the United States lives with some form of mental illness at varying degrees of severity? Also, according to the National Alliance on Mental Illness, one in five youths between the ages of 13 to 18 experience severe mental health challenges at some point during this stage.

I'd like you to think for a minute about the individuals in our church. I know that you know more than five of them. Statistically you now know one out of five of those individuals potentially struggles with mental health challenges, and if you have ten people on your mind, there is a very good chance that two or more of those people are struggling with mental health. Perhaps it's even you or your best friend at church.

You may find yourself asking "What does mental health mean, and why is it so important?" Well, just as we have physical health that requires effort to maintain, we also have mental health, that requires a degree of maintenance as well. Unfortunately, our society (while admittedly making improvements) has placed a stigma on

those experiencing mental health challenges. We all, at some point, experience mild to severe mental health challenges, such as depression and/or anxiety. I can personally tell you that I struggle with anxiety, and at times have experienced depression and actually take daily medication for it. Does that change your mind about me? Does that make you look at me different? Do you think I am fit to still be your deacon here at church? Even more so, am I still fit to be a therapist (which is what I do for a living)? The simple answer is YES; people with mental health challenges can and do live normal lives, and can be productive members of society. That said, let me also make clear, there are certain mental health challenges so severe that individuals can not work, and they do need to be taken care of, but that does not make them any less important than you or I, nor that our Creator has left them or forgotten about them. You will see a fair number of these individuals end up as part of our homeless populations because their mental health was never nurtured or cared for before it got out of control.

Let me pose a question. What do you think would happen to a person with a physical illness who neglected to take care of themselves with diet, exercise, or medicine? Or a person who chose to ignore their doctor's recommendations? Do you think that person has a better chance of a long, active life? Or do you think the person who follows the doctor's recommendations has a better chance? It's no different with mental health. If we do not recognize, acknowledge, and take care of the problem, it can exacerbate to the point the challenge becomes debilitating.

We need to STOP the stigma that surrounds mental health. It is nothing to be ashamed or embarrassed of, and it is no less important than our physical health.

Remember *Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me"*. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to give you the strength to seek help if you are struggling, as you do not have to go through it alone.

They're expecting us. About twenty men and women, most looking no different than you and me, although life on the streets is hard.

A small group of us meet every second and fifth Saturday from 11 am to noon assembling grinder sandwiches, cold drinks, chips and a snack. It's an enjoyable time of fellowship. At noon, we deliver to those waiting under the arches at Calvary Presbyterian Church. We even have snacks for canine friends.

One gentleman shows tender care for his dogs: "They help me sleep," he says.

Every day I meet with my Lord and thank Him for what I have: a clear mind, a roof over my head, clean clothes, insurance, a car, computers, and phones. Step out of your comfort zone and join us. Giving to others, you bring joy to yourself.

For the last three or four years, Sally and I have been financially supporting a Holiday feeding program in Oklahoma City that close friends of ours have been involved with for over ten years. This program prepares a hot meal for families that are down on their luck and need a break, not a homeless feeding program. The meal will provide plenty of food for a family of ten and even provide leftovers. After ten years, the program provides a thousand boxes of food and feeds over 10,000 people in the Oklahoma City area.

This past Holiday season we decided there are a lot of families down on their luck in our area so why not try to duplicate our friends effort. A thousand food boxes were out of the question, but could we

start with ten? We visited with some close friends in the church and community and were



able to accomplish our initial goal. The program in Oklahoma City is called DINNER WITH LOVE and they have provided us with recipes, packing instructions and even boxes. Their input has been invaluable.

Everyone who was involved this past year felt good about the program. We intend to continue the program this year with a goal of fifty boxes. We of course are looking for volunteers to cook and some to deliver. Our hope is to find an industrial kitchen to use and start a non-profit foundation. Anyone with an interest we welcome the discussion. More information is available from Sally, Jim and Joy Bower and of course myself.

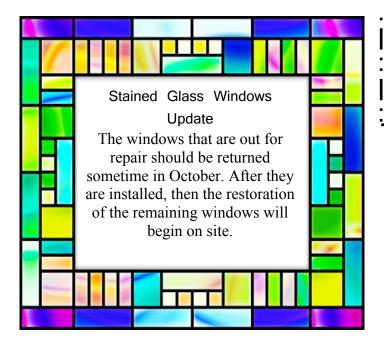

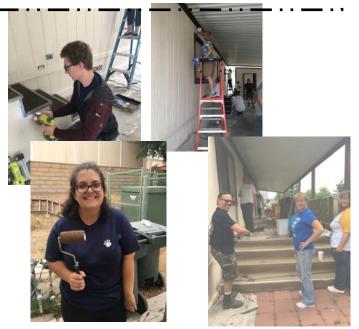

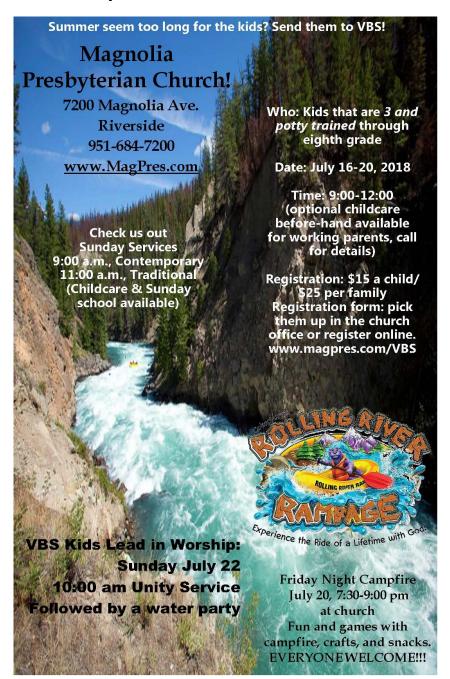
