If you've participated in worship during the month of August, you've probably heard about a practice I've picked up during the pandemic: consuming Ice Cream Floats. While consuming ice cream floats is not ideal for me healthwise, I've also started a new practice during the month of August: bike riding.

Once a week I have been riding with Clarke Prescott, who is a retired Episcopal Priest, and one of MagPres' newest members. What is notable about our bike rides is that we ride a tandem bike together. Imagine, driving through the Southeast side of Riverside and seeing two men, one the size of your male co-pastor, riding on a tandem bike throughout the neighborhoods. It must be a sight, because people can't hide their reactions when

we pass by. Often people's mouths will be open in surprise () while others will smile at us while continuing their gaze for an unusually long time. Clarke has mentioned that tandem bike riding is a great metaphor for the church and is a great source of sermon illustrations. I'd like to share one that has come to mind over the last month.

Riding a tandem bike involves reacting to another person's movements. When one rider shifts their weight, the other rider has to adjust. When one wants to pedal faster or slower, the other adapts. Both riders have to do their part to make the ride to be successful. This understanding also describes the Presbyterian way of doing ministry.


When one part of the church leans in one direction, other parts of the church have to adjust. When one part of the church gets excited about the progress of a new building, other parts adapt. It is when the church as a whole works together that the journey becomes successful.

I have experienced this co-pastorate in a similar way. Pastor Claire and I have formed a great team. But for the last month, as she has participated in a well deserved, month-long sabbatical, it felt at times, like I've been riding a tandem bike alone. It was a different experience. But we all adapted well.

I am grateful to have my co-pastor back in the saddle this month. I am looking forward to hearing about her sabbatical and excited to have her energy. I am eager to see her reactions to the build-

ing design concept, as I am eager to see yours as well. One lesson I've come to learn over the last month is that riding a tandem bike alone isn't very fun. I am excited to welcome Pastor Claire back and I hope you'll take the opportunity to welcome her back too.

Exciting News from your Session!!! Sanctuary Design is here!!!

On September 6, Session will have a video presentation available after 3 pm. at Mag-Pres. online.church, revealing the proposed Sanctuary Design! They are super excited to share this initial design concept with you and get your feedback. After the presentation, there will be two questions asked via electronic survey:

1) What do you see in the plan that excites you? 2) What do you want Session to know going forward? (You may also call the office to receive a hard copy of the survey.)

To get to this place, there were many steps involved. The basic time-line was this:

April-June 2019: Elders on Session participated in "Rooted"- a 10-week book study in which they explored their visions for Magnolia and the missions of the Church.

Following the study, 2019: Information gathering took place, asking for input from all

Committees and Deacons - wish-lists, ideas, design elements, etc.
July 2019: Session took all of that information and prioritized the pieces they felt were of vital importance to meeting their vision and mission for Magnolia.

Design Team then took that information to the Architect and he incorporated those

ideas/wishes into an initial design.

August 19, 2020: The design concept was presented at Session for approval, so it could go to the City for their approval...without this step of City approval, nothing else could take place (ie: demo, fine-tuning of plan).

This design concept is only a start; Session only approved the basic foot-print, or shell of the building. Almost anything can be up for discussion. The Session wants to be sure to have a full understanding of both the city and congregations' input before moving to the next stage of the design.

Please watch the video presentation on Sunday and keep an open heart for this initial phase! The Session thanks you for your prayers and grace during this exciting process!
