Minister's Musings

September 2022

"There's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens... Ecclesiastes 3:1

love fall! Yeah, yeah, I know we live in SoCal, we don't have REAL seasons like in other parts of the country. I would argue that we do though, they are just a lot more subtle. We can go up to the mountains or to Oak Glen to see the fall colors--not East



Coast fall colors, but they are there if you look closely. Soon, when we walk out in the morning, we will sense a difference in the air, a crispness, a thinness; almost imperceptible, but there nonetheless.

Sometimes that is what our spiritual life can be like. We can have seasons where God is so in our face that it just blows us away like a Santa Ana wind and other times God is like a whisper or feels very, very far away. St. John of the Cross, a 16th century Spanish mystic calls this distant feeling "the dark night of the soul." If you have ever experienced this darkness, this seeming separation, you know it can be a bit disconcerting. Like many people of faith, there have been times in my life where I have wondered if God was there. I have felt that in times of grief, in times of stress, and in times of boredom.

Recently, I had an in-your-face experience of God when I went to Cardiff State Beach on my day off. I walked around a rock jetty that was jutting out into the ocean and around the bend there was a lagoon or estuary that ran out to meet the ocean.

I found a quiet place in the sand, nestled in the rocks, just big enough for me and started praying the Lovingkindness Prayer for each of my friends

and family, for you my church, for

the surfers and people walking their dogs, for the families on the beach. I closed my eyes and sat in quiet, breathing in deep salt air, feeling the breeze, hearing the sounds of the gulls and children playing in the distance. After about an hour (I prayed for a lot of people!), I opened my eyes to the lagoon in front of me in time to see a young blond boy of eight or so swimming toward me and as I looked at this boy, tears started to flow. Even now as a recall this time and sit with it, I can feel the pinprick of tears forming. I do not know what it all means. I do not fully know yet what God was revealing to me in that moment but what I do know is that God's Spirit touched me in a simple, poignant and profound way.

My prayer for you is that as we transition into this autumn time, you will spend time in quiet; noticing, letting go, and resting with expectation of what new thing God is birthing in you.


Change can lead to healthier lifestyles and better mental health. The pandemic has led many of us to find that comfort zone in our homes. Society has taken to working, schooling and worshipping on line and has diminished our sense of belonging. As the pandemic has lessened, many have returned to the office or school but the environment is not the same; it has *changed*. The sense of belonging has changed with it because the routine changed and adjustments were needed to adapt. Belonging to a group or in a particular setting or environment is essential and fundamental. It is craved. A University of

Michigan study revealed that the lack of belonging is a predicator to depression. The pandemic, as many have noted, has created many more cases of depression than ever before.

Now that MagPres has returned to worshipping in person, there are several ways to slowly re-adjust to the changes created by the pandemic and foster the need to belong again. A fun way to dip your toe in the water (not the deep waters and Simon did) is perhaps change where you sit. We all have our favorite parking spaces or favorite pew. By changing where you sit, you may find a different perspective or even meet some one new. Another way to establish a sense of belonging is by considering your talents. We all have an untapped talent that yearns to shine. Fear holds us back. SESSION HIGHLIGHTS



Session Committee highlights continue... this month, Endowment

Who's Who on Endowment? Chaired by Elder Jay Nicholson, Jeff Ludwig, Jan McKee, Pastor Claire, and Pastor Paul.

Roles and Responsibilities (as stated in the Standing Rules of Session):

- 1. Promote and administer the Magnolia Presbyterian Church program of wills, gifts, memorials, and other gifts that are placed with the Endowment Fund
- 2. Inform the congregation about Christian stewardship, promote the MagPres Endowment Fund as an ongoing means for supporting the mission of the church, and administer the Endowment Fund
- 3. Maintain the integrity of the Endowment Fund by preserving Fund principal and expending only investment income
- 4. Ensure Endowment Fund disbursements are utilized for their expressed purpose
- 5. Maintain the endowment records and/or notebook, listing those who have created endowment funds and update it as new funds are started, to acknowledge our heritage and to encourage new gifts.
- 6. Receive requests for disbursements of Endowment investment income
 - Adjudicate requests for disbursements of Endowment investment income of less than \$1,000
 - Make recommendations to Session regarding requests larger than \$1,000
- 7. Develop an annual committee budget in coordination with the Stewardship and Finance Committee, and manage committee budget on a monthly basis
- 8. Oversee other funds related to its work, in conjunction with the Stewardship and Finance committee

The purpose of this committee is to "Encourage Christian Stewardship of accumulated resources."

Combined Endowment Funds – Spotlight on Those Who Made Them Possible

In the April 2022 Uplook, we listed four new endowment funds that had recently been created by combining funds in each category. In May, we highlighted the four donors who contributed to the Where Most Needed combined fund. This month (September), we would like to spotlight the two donors who made up the Great Commission combined fund. In October, we will spotlight those who made up the Youth Ministries combined fund, and in November, the Christian Education combined fund. Their foresight and generosity continue to bless our church.

The following information is printed below as it was originally submitted by the donor(s) for our Endowment Registry Notebook, which is kept in the church office, and maintained and updated by the Endowment Committee for all of our funds.

Helen Wallace



Helen joined Magnolia Presbyterian Church as menber #1865 on February 24, 1963. Her parents were also members of the church. She lived behind the church on Potomac and enjoyed walking to worship services on Sunday mornings.

Some members might also remember her driving a 1960 green and white Rambler from time to time. Helen was founder of the church's Telecare outreach program that lasted from 1972 to 1999. In addition to her devotion to church work, Helen was also very devoted to other causes, as well. On numerous occasions, she went door to door collecting money for the

American Heart Association. The City of Riverside honored Helen in 1984 for her Volunteerism. Helen Wallace died on December 17, 1997, at the age of 98, and was the oldest member of the church at that time. She had been a member of Magnolia for 34

years and had been dearly loved and respected by everyone in the congregation.

<u>Del Majocchi</u> (Edited from Cornerstone Magazine - Spg 2005):

"My husband passed away at the end of 2001. While he was living, we invested a lot in real estate," Majocchi said. "I hadn't realized,

and I'm sure that he hadn't either, that our estate would be worth so much."

The Majocchis had no children; therefore she wanted to make sure that her estate would be used in a way that would support the charities that she holds dear. Her attorney suggested several avenues of charitable giving and she wanted to also provide for her Church. So she consulted with her local pastor, Reverend Dr. Bradley C. Copeland, at Magnolia Presbyterian Church, in Riverside, California.

"She has a heart of giving," said Copeland. "I listened to her and pointed her in the right direction." Copeland put her in touch with John Turner, development officer for the area's Presbyterian Foundation.

"At first she wasn't sure what she wanted to do," said Turner. "We talked about a couple of options when I met with her and her attorney, and we thought the gift annuities would be attractive to her."

"I knew nothing about annuities, nothing at all, said Majocchi. But the more she learned about gift annuities, the more she realized that she was making the right decision.

"The Presbyterian Foundation was the one I chose because, as a Christian, I felt that they would do what I want with my money," said Majocchi. "Also, I would like to honor my husband's wishes."

Turner worked very hard to find ministry uses in the areas that she wanted to support. "She liked the idea that our General Assembly agencies could do an as-good or better job than other non-profits," said Turner. He also brought Environmental Justice, the African American Leadership Advancement Program, and the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program to Majocchi's attention. Majocchi was impressed with the mission of these agencies and elected to establish a permanent endowment fund with the Foundation for their benefit, with the charitable remainder interest of one of her gift annuities. The Della Majocchi Fund will provide perpetual income to the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), restricted for these agencies.

Copeland believes it was not just the Foundation's expertise, but also Turner's responsiveness and trusting manner that ultimately brought Majocchi to the Foundation. "John has such a pleasant and caring personality about him," said Copeland. "He is interested in doing what the donor wants, and it comes across loud and clear. I think that's why she went with the

Foundation; she met people who cared about her and cared about what she wanted to do."

Majocchi also liked the opportunity she had to continue to give to her favorite causes. In total, she has created five gift annuities in a two-year span.

Majocchi will also be providing support for her beloved Magnolia Presbyterian Church in Riverside. "I've been a member for ten years, the Reverend Brad Copeland has been there for 25 years, and the church just celebrated its 125th anniversary here in Riverside," she said.

"She is an extremely active member here," said Copeland. "She became involved in Bible study and is very biblically-literate. She also has a real love for children....She is a very thoughtful, deep woman. She has a lot of friends here in this congregation."

A former elementary school teacher, Majocchi works regularly in the church's after-school program and is involved at the tutoring center. She began her career as a teacher in the early 1940s and then World War II began. She enlisted in the 9th Air Force and was attached to the communication corps. "I was in England before D-Day in the 9th Air Force. After D-Day, we went to France and Germany," said Majocchi. "We were scared to death because we were in France during the Battle of the Bulge and that was a very tricky situation."

After the war, she took advantage of an opportunity to spend time in the Belgian Congo teaching at a boys' school for bi-racial young men who were not accepted by any other schools. From 1948 to

1954, she taught children ages 6-18. She taught all of the children enrolled at that school. "The Eastern Congo is absolutely beautiful. There was a church already established there, and the Christians were just wonderful. Even as simple as their life was, they understood the gospel message, said Majocchi.

Even though Majocchi is happy that she is able to provide such support for her favorite causes, she remains humble about her giving. "I don't like to feel like I'm bragging, and I don't go around telling people what I am doing," she said. "I grew up during the Depression, and everything was very difficult. I think the Lord has really blessed me that I am able to do this." Certainly the Presbyterian mission activities that Majocchi will support for many years feel blessed the she is such a giving person.

"It's wonderful," said Majocchi. "It's more blessed to give that to receive, I'm telling you."




