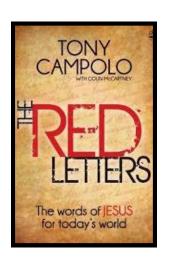
## **Growth Group FAQs**

### A PASTOR'S PONDERING

The last two months have been filled with students going back to school, many in August, and some based on the more traditional post-Labor Day start. For me, I go back to school this month, beginning a Doctor of Ministry program through the New Theological Seminary of the West.

As I began to communicate this information a number of people, a few questions have come up:

What is a Doctor of Ministry?

A Doctor of Ministry Degree is a professional degree that prepares pastors for deeper, more effective ministry. It is a professional and/or practical doctorate degree (not unlike the MD degree for medicine) as opposed to a research/teaching degree (the Ph.D in most fields). It is intended for people employed as pastors of congregations (one of the requirements is that an applicant must be 3 years removed from a Master of Divinity Degree and been in ministry leadership during that time) who desire an advanced education without committing to the residential and time requirements that a research/ teaching degree requires (usually 5 years of full time study/research/ classes). It allows pastors to continue pastoring in their churches, while completing the requirements for the degree

How will my pursuit of this degree affect MagPres?

Initially, there won't be any noticeable difference. I will attend classes and complete assignments during off-hours and utilizing study leave and/or vacation, so the work that I do as a Co-Pastor of this congregation won't look any different. Later in the program, it will hopefully have a significant impact.

### A MINISTER'S MUSING

...but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength; they will fly up on wings like eagles; they will run and not be tired; they will walk and not be weary. Is. 40:31

Several weeks back now, I and several other women from MagPres took a week-long trip up to the Eastern Sierras. June Lake area to be specific. I had told the other experienced backpackers that I would go with them as long as we camped in one spot and just took day hikes. I had no desire to sleep on the ground or carry a 50-pound pack. Yes, I can hear some of you now, "Wimp!" As we made our plans for the following day's hike of 3.4 miles roundtrip to Fern Lake, I was confident that it would not be too difficult for me. I had water, my lunch, and experienced hikers with me-what could go wrong? As we began our ascent that kept going up-up-up, I kept hoping for the trail (?) to level off to give me some kind of respite from the pain I was now experiencing. It was hot, there were boulders, fallen logs, waah!waah!waah! An hour into the hike and my legs were like jello and I was beginning to doubt the wisdom of my decision. Added to that was the realization that I was slowing everyone else down. I am a pretty independent person but as I continued to walk I realized that I was going to need the help of my fellow hikers and I also needed Jesus! Yep, so there went my pride as well. It also didn't help that there were people running up the trail for their morning jog. Show-offs! Yep, there went my charity toward my fellow man. In my defense it was a 1500-ft. elevation rise in 1.7 miles, which is pretty steep. Yep, now in the rationalization stage.

As I think back on that experience I realize that sometimes our lives go like that. We make plans, prepare, have expectations of how it's going to go, and set out only to realize that things are going very differently than we anticipated. And we are brought up short. We cry "foul" at the universe, we get discouraged, we get angry, we start comparing our lives to others', we become resentful or critical, and on and on and on...BUT it doesn't have to be like that.

A devotional I read this morning said, "It is comforting to think of trouble, in whatever form it may come to us, as a heavenly messenger, bringing us something from God. In its earthly aspect it may seem hurtful...but in its spiritual outworking it yields blessing. Many of the richest blessings...from the past are the fruit of sorrow or pain." I have found this to be true in my own life and hope it will be that for you as well. What was the blessing that came out of that hike? I became closer to Debbie, Margy, and Brenda. I realized that 10 years ago I could barely walk on flat ground before my joint replacements and it was a different kind of pain than I had before. I experienced God's beauty in a way that most people don't ever see. And I came away from that week proud of myself for even attempting something I hadn't done in 30 years.

### Continued Pastor's Pondering

Part of the requirements for the degree is to create, test, evaluate, analyze, and report on a project. As I begin this journey, I recognize that we are already on a journey of "sharing God's love with all and growing in relationship with Jesus Christ and with one another." I pray my journey will help us in our journey.

"Our Year of Commitment" August Financial Report

The Treasurer's Report contains great news!

It appears that many of you have taken our Stewardship theme for 2018 to heart, "Our Year of Commitment."

Our income for August was \$230,300.99 and expenses were \$214,319.52.

This results in a current positive balance of \$15,981.47 as of July 31<sup>st</sup>. Praise God!!

Also, if we consider the \$8,146.25 of endowment interest and \$5,885.57 of deficit reduction funds that were budgeted to meet potential shortfalls, our adjusted balance for August is \$30,013.29.

Thank you for supporting your Church's 2018 budget by staying current with your pledge. The Stewardship Committee is confident that our church family will stay committed to the use of their Time, Talent and Treasures for our church.
