### Session Highlights THE DESIGN CONCEPT REVEALED

By now, your Session hopes you have had a chance to see the initial design concept draft the architect presented for the Sanctuary. If you were unable to see it on-line, please call the office and have a hard copy sent to you.

When this same presentation was made to Session in August, there was excitement to this first step in moving forward on re-building Magnolia's Sanctuary. The Design Team highlighted the inverted roof-line to look like an open Bible; the indoor breezeway connecting the Sanctuary to the office building; moving the building closer to Magnolia Avenue; the removal of the wall between the parking lot and the building; intentional design as both a Sanctuary and multi-use space; storage areas; and the small kitchen to continue the Magnolia Café ministry.



The Elders on Session expressed their excitement about the design of getting out of the box; not staying within any limitations; flipping the footprint ninety degrees; the contemporary feel to the design; and the cry room for parents with young children.

They also had questions as to what thought was given to the acoustics of the design; future worship style; long-term feasability, compared to cost, of a pipe organ; and the decrease in seating capacity from 388 to 300.

Now it's your turn to respond to the survey questions with your input and comments. Once the city of Riverside approves the initial footprint, demo of the old building and fine-tuning of the plan can proceed.

The Session of Magnolia Presbyterian has revealed the proposed Sanctuary Design! They are super excited to share this initial design concept with you and get your feedback. Please view the presentation, and give feedback via electronic survey:

- 1) What do you see in the plan that excites you?
- 2) What questions do you have?
- 3) What do you want Session to know going forward?

(You may also call the office to receive a hard copy of the survey.)

To get to this place, there were many steps involved. The basic time-line was this:

April-June 2019: Elders on Session participated in "Rooted"- a 10-week book study in which they explored their visions for Magnolia and the missions of the Church.

Following the study, 2019: Information gathering took place, asking for input from all Committees and Deacons - wish-lists, ideas, design elements, etc.

July 2019: Session took all of that information and prioritized the pieces they felt were of vital importance to meeting their vision and mission for Magnolia.

Design Team then took that information to the Architect and he incorporated those ideas/wishes into an initial design.

August 19, 2020: The design concept was presented at Session for approval, so it could go to the City for their approval...without this step of City approval, nothing else could take place (ie: demo, fine-tuning of plan).

This design concept is only a start; Session only approved the basic foot-print, or shell of the building. Almost anything can be up for discussion. The Session wants to be sure to have a full understanding of both the city and congregations' input before moving to the next stage of the design.

Please watch the video presentation if you haven't already and keep an open heart for this initial phase! The Session thanks you for your prayers and grace during this exciting process!


