A Pastor's Pondering



"We may be uncertain what the future holds but we can be certain who holds our future." These words began a pastoral letter to the congregation back in March, which in COVID time, feels like a few years ago now. Seemingly there is just as much uncertainty today as there was in March, when we made the shift to an online-only worship experience. Businesses are still struggling, some of our children are struggling with doing school virtually, and meaningful, financially supporting jobs seem difficult to come by. Despite the struggles and uncertainty, I am confident there are

blessings that have come from this time as well.

For me, personally, I have appreciated the opportunity to worship together with my family, yes, sometimes in my pajamas. Pre-pandemic, I would watch as family, attending the 11am service, would be scattered: Michelle with the choir and the boys with friends or on their own. But because our worship is online-only, we are able to sit together on our living room couch and participate together. I have also appreciated the participation from our congregation in leading worship; you all who have volunteered to record yourself reading a part for the worship service. I hope that will become a staple of our worship services, even when we return to in-person worship. I have appreciated family gatherings, even as we practice them in socially distant ways, and sometimes via zoom. Pre-pandemic I remember getting frustrated when a family member who has difficulty hearing asked me to repeat myself, over and over. But my joy in seeing and being around this loved one covers any frustration I might experience from needing to repeat myself.

"Give thanks in every situation because this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." -1 Thessalonians 5:18 (CEB)

We set aside time, every November, to appreciate things: to give thanks. What are you thankful for? Yes our holiday celebrations will be different this year: no door to door trick-or-treating, no church Thanksgiving Dinner (meaning we won't get any of Laura's cooking), potentially no large family gatherings at Thanksgiving, and not on Christmas either. Even in the midst of lamenting the year 2020, the year that was so different from every year before it, can we express thankfulness for what we do have?

Magnolia Sanctuary re-build....

Here are the steps that have been taken so far:

April-June 2019: Elders on Session participated in "Rooted" - a 10-week book study in which they explored their visions for Magnolia and the missions of the Church.

Following the study, 2019: Information gathering took place, asking for input from all Committees and Deacons – wish-lists, ideas, design elements, etc.

July 2019: Session took all of that information and prioritized the pieces they felt were of vital importance to meeting their vision and mission for Magnolia. Design Team then took that information to the Architect and he incorporated those ideas/wishes into an initial design.

August 19, 2020: The design concept was presented at Session for approval, so it could go to the City for their approval...without this step of City approval, nothing else could take place (ie: demo, finetuning of plan).

Next Steps:

October 14, 2020: Deadline for congregation to submit responses to design

Elders will contact those members that did not respond to the design to see if you have comments to share

October 22, 2020: Session had a workshop to review responses and develop plans to respond to questions asked, and how to proceed with ideas/suggestions that were given, and to decide on steps to be taken moving forward.

Once initial plans are approved by the city, demolition of the fire-damaged Sanctuary will begin. Fine-tuning and making adjustments to the design plan

Other important highlights from your Session:

The Re-opening team (Elders Brenda Flowers, David King, Sherry Nettles, Ann Laudermilk and Co-Pastor
Claire Schlegel) is planning to meet soon to develop protocols for in-person worship services as Riverside
County begins (at least a the time of this writing) to loosens restrictions...

At a Called Session meeting on September 24, 2020 your Elders approved housing a family of 8 (2 parents;
6 children) in our Christian Education youth room. They had been staying at Path of Life and exceeded
that stay, and needed a place for 2-5 weeks until they could secure an apartment. All concerns and details
were discussed and Elder Deanna Cohen was empowered to develop a list of restrictions and the authority
to communicate all pertinent information to the family. It was expressed that "Magnolia has always been
its best when doing Mission work."

Happy birthday to — and for — you!

Birthdays are unique because they celebrate who someone *is,* not what they've *done.* Henri Nouwen wrote, "It is more important to celebrate a birthday than a successful exam, a promotion or a victory. Because to celebrate a birthday means to say to someone, 'Thank you for being you.' ... On a birthday we do not say, 'Thanks for what you did, or said, or accomplished.' No, we say, 'Thank you for being born and being among us.'"

To rejoice over someone purely for who they are is an echo of God's joy over us. Some families celebrate "baptism birthdays" (anniversaries) by lighting candles, sharing scripture and prayer, perhaps looking at photos and recounting stories of that milestone event that marked the beginning of their faith life.

On a birthday, said Nouwen, "we lift someone up and let everyone say, 'We love you." In baptism, God lifts us to his very heart and declares, "You are my precious child. I love you."
