FROM OUR MUSIC DIRECTOR

The O Antiphons/O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Once again, we find ourselves in the midst of Advent while focused on Christmas and all its busyness. You may be looking for something to use in your devotional life that connects with the deep meaning of Christmas and the promised Messiah. There is an ancient

text in our hymnal you can use in your Advent devotions – the O Antiphons.

An antiphon is simply a sung response to a spoken text. In some traditions, the O Antiphons are sung, one antiphon each day, from

December 17 to 23. They are reflections on seven attributes of the promised Savior, taken

from the book of Isaiah. The Presbyterian Book of Common Worship includes a version of them to be read in morning or evening prayer. In the 18th century, the antiphons began to be sung to the tune we know as "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." #88 in *Glory to God*. While most hymnals do not include all seven verses, the Presbyterian hymnal does, though the verses appear in a different order from the original antiphons. The seven antiphons are:

- O Wisdom of our God Most High; guiding creation with power and love:
 - come to teach us the path of knowledge. (Isaiah 11:2-3; 28:29)
- **O Leader** of the House of Israel, giver of the law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power. (Isaiah 11:4-5; 33:22)
- O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay! (Isaiah 1:1; 11:10)
- O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness! (Isaiah 9:6; 22:22
- O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death. (Isaiah 9.1)
- O King of the Nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust! (Isaiah 9:5; 2:4)
- O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of law: come to save us, Lord our God. (Isaiah 7:14)

In your devotional time, you might read the texts from Isaiah and sing the appropriate stanza of the hymn or meditate on its meaning in your life. You can also listen to some of the many recordings of the O Antiphons on YouTube.





people. The community of Riverside is a special place to work. Thank you for your ongoing love and




support. Please plan to come to Meeting #4 on Monday, December 9th at 7:00 pm at Magnolia. Please invite the community as well as your church friends!

We'd like to thank you, for all your prayers,






