How will we deal with change? When God's people were enslaved in Israel, and they experienced change, freedom from slavery, they murmured, complained, and longed for what they knew. When God's people lost their temple, they lamented and retold stories of how great it was, exaggerating what actually was. When God's people were in exile, they cried out to God and longed for what they knew.

Over the last 6 years we at MagPres have dealt with significant change, including: a co-pastor model, which we hadn't had since 1992; a building that was destroyed by fire; worshipping in our historic worship space; Rooted; worshipping online because it wasn't possible to meet in-person safely.

Throughout this time, we were led by God into a new way being. Not only have we survived, but in many ways, we have thrived (how many of you could use Zoom before?).

Transitions are difficult. Change is hard. But just as God has been with God's people throughout change in the past, God continues to be with us now. Jesus' final words as recorded in the Gospel of Matthew says, "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Praise be to God for God's presence with us as we venture once again into an unknown future.

DEACONS

THE OFFICE OF DEACON/DEACONESS

"Deacon" roughly translates to "servant." The first appearance in the Bible of what we know as the chosen servants to the Christian community were not originally called deacons.

As recorded in the New Testament book, Acts of the Apostles (Chapter 6), the first recognized deacons were known as "The Seven." These were seven men chosen by the 12 Apostles to serve those in the community. Their responsibility was to take care of some of the daily needs of the Church community. This allowed the Apostles to focus on prayer and teaching of the Word. The chosen men were Stephen (the first martyr of Christianity), Philip (the Evangelist), Prochorus (one of the seventy-two sent out by Jesus in Luke 10), Nicanor (martyred), Timon (believed to have been martyred in Greece), Parmenas (Tradition says he preached in what is today western Türkiye), and Nicolas from Antioch.

The Bible also cites the contribution of deaconesses. In Romans 16:1, Phoebe is mentioned for her generosity to the Apostle Paul. Other women deacons mentioned in the New Testament include, Chloe (1 Corinthians 1), Nympha (Colossians 4), Apphia (Philemon 2), Euodia and Syntyche (Philippians 4), Junia (Romans 16), and the husband-andwife team of Priscilla and Aquila (Romans 16).

Here at Magnolia Presbyterian Church, there is a Deacon Board with 15 deacon positions. Each deacon is assigned to a flock of congregants. Your current Deacon Board consists of 13 deacons dedicated to care for the congregation and assisting the elders and pastors. These individuals include





Casa Esperanza is an Orphanage in Mexico that takes in all kinds of children, even those with disabilities. Many places down there won't bother with kids with disabilities as there simply isn't enough resources, money, people and time to help those with special needs

and also those without special needs. But this place takes them all. A couple of years ago their landlord passed away and his wife decided to raise their rent by an additional \$1000 per month. They could not afford such an increase so they relocated to an area a few miles away, on the outskirts of the town. The land had some existing buildings on it, but looters had stripped all of

the plumbing and wiring out of the place for salvage so there was a lot of work that need-

least livable, and a good safe place for the kids to attend school, play and learn about Jesus. The caretakers are a loving couple that have given their lives to helping these thrown away kids. In 2022, when Power Ministry was here helping, we built a couple of additional buildings, an apartment for a couple of the adult counselors, a storage facility and helped fix some roofs on the existing buildings. At that time they had about 75 kids here.

Pentecost Sunday

Pentecost Sunday is May28th. Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing us to the church of the future. Each year, this celebration is marked by receiving the Pentecost Offering which nurtures the faith of those who are the church to come.

Pentecost arrives 50 days after Easter and 10 days after the Ascension-when Jesus ascends into heaven. Jesus and the Scriptures are making an important theological point at Pentecost. Jesus ascends and the church is born. If the mission and ministry is to continue, it is upon us, his disciples, to keep it going, and we have the Holy Spirit to lead us, who blesses us all with different gifts to be used at different times and in different ways.

These gifts of the Spirit are bestowed upon us to be used for the "building up of the body of Christ" (Ephesians 4:12). Our gifts to the Pentecost Offering connect with God's hope and future, supporting ministries with children, youth and young adults by building a life of faith. Your Gifts at Work: 40% stays with our congregation, The rest to Presbyterian Mission Agency; 25% goes to guiding Youth Ministries, 25% serving communities young adult volunteers, and 10% Child Advocacy. CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL for children in grades




