NEWS YOU CAN USE!



Well site activities are progressing. They are now pumping water through the muddy well shaft until it too is clear water. That will happen the week of June 26 with the pump running 24/7 for several days. Murky water is being removed by truck tankers. When the water is fairly clear, they will pump it into the storm drain via the curb & gutter on Magnolia Ave. When the water is satisfactorily clear, they will build a block wall enclosure similar to the cell site building and then install all necessary long term pumping equipment and apparatus. Some time during this process the drilling rig will move on and the container sound wall will be dismantled and moved to the next well site. This should all occur by mid or end of July. They have agreed to and budgeted for the repaving of a substantial portion of our parking lot that has seen industrial use. There is an end in sight. ~Tim Lewis

DEACON'S CORNER

Since I volunteered to write the deacon's message for this month's news bulletin, I now sit here wondering about what to write. I prayerfully reflect upon what I have determined to be the main focus of the past month or so of Sunday sermons. As I do this, an old song from Catholic parochial school Thursday children's mass comes to mind: "Whatsoever You Do", which reflects on one of the sub-themes of Matthew 25 (If you'd like to hear the song, here is a link to it on YouTube: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=125Hqnf3uk.).

Chapter 25 is Jesus's instructions to the disciples as to how to be ready for the Kingdom of God: to be always alert and prepared, as were the wise virgins who brought enough oil; to demonstrate courageous stewardship, as did the wise servants; and to minister to the "least" of humanity, with whom Jesus socially positions himself, claiming that when we minister to them, or choose not to, that is what we do to Jesus.

The difficult parts of this chapter are the repetitive reminders of the consequence of not being prepared, courageous, stewards and ministers, that consequence of being banned from the Kingdom of God. However, I take comfort in knowing that it is Love that saves us, and it is this Love that prods us into the courageous actions mentioned above, and it is these actions that are the physical evidence that shows this Love that draws others to God.

Therefore, it is my prayer for all of us that we may always know in our hearts that God's Love continuously reminds us, gives us courage, and nurtures and ministers to us, and that we can know that this is what protects us from everything that we fear, from everything that prevents us from living to our full potential in Christ Jesus, and that we will always encourage and minister to each other, and that our church will always be a place that is illuminates the way to the Kingdom of God.
