Growing up and going to school, I loved it when teachers would take roll. As my classmates responded with the word "here" upon hearing their names, I often chose instead to say the word, "present," which often elicited a laugh or two from others. I had an unusual affinity for this word, "present." Perhaps it is because I was born on Christmas Day, 36 years ago, and this word was my way of claiming that I was a gift to the class in addition to acknowledging I was physically present. Maybe it was because this word allowed me to be different from my fellow classmates. Possibly it was because the word started with the letter "P." I'm not really sure why, but I do like the word.

The Rev. Timm High, who serves our presbytery as the Presbytery Leader for Mission and Vision and Stated Clerk, uses the word often in this way, whether verbally or in writing:

"Thank you for your presence and your presents."

Timm's usage of this word reminded me of my positive attachment to this word, and reminds me of the (big P) Presence that is so present in my life.

As we enter into this Christmas season and begin the exchange presents, may we be reminded of the Present who became present to us all and is still present to anyone desiring His presence. And as you remember and celebrate:

"Keep it simple". This is the phrase my friend Patricia and I say to one another whenever we go camping together or invite each other's families over for a meal. Most of the time I am not very successful at it, mainly because cooking for others is how I show my love and care for them. I come from a long line of women who never kept it simple when it came to entertaining (thus my obsession with table linens). Lately however this phrase "keep it simple" has been like an earworm in my head that won't leave. Part of it I admit comes from looking ahead to one of the busiest times of the year for Pastors. But I think also a big part of it is out of response to the devastation of the wildfires this month.

So, with the holidays approaching and gift buying and giving on the horizon I've been reflecting on whether I really need anymore "stuff". Do I need to stand in line for hours on Black Friday or spend hours online for Cyber

Monday or the insanity of last-minute Christmas Eve stocking stuffer CVS trips or is there a better way to spend my time and money? What is really important at Christmastime? Is it the decorating, lighting, baking, eating, buying, present opening? Which I admit are all things I

love. Or is it more about spending time with family and friends, going to church on Christmas Eve, or singing carols? Is it more about Santa Claus or is it about that baby born in humble surroundings? I wonder why the Word became flesh and made his home among us as a King wrapped in swaddling clothes lying in an animal feeding trough instead of a palace. Would it be a different kind of message, a different kind of Savior, if Jesus' birth and life were not so simple? Would our message be different?

In full disclosure, I am not completely ready for a "simple Christmas". I feel I need to ease into it, to "do a small thing" as Pastor Paul preached on a few weeks back. So, my one small thing will be to give money to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance for the fire victims, instead of buying gifts for my friends. As you look forward to this Advent/Christmas season, may you feel blessed and loved and share it with others-

It appears that many of you have taken our Stewardship theme for 2018 to heart, "Our Year of Commitment". Our income for October was \$342,260.23 and expenses were \$325,670.89.

This results in a current positive balance of \$16,589.34 as of October 31st. Praise God!!

Also, if we consider the \$11,637.50 of endowment interest

and \$8,407.95 of deficit reduction funds that were budgeted to meet potential shortfalls, our adjusted balance for October is \$36,634.79.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

He ended by saying "Both of these paths are faithful; but as we enter this year of 'fearless generosity', I invite you to consider, which one is fearless?"
