### A Pastor's Pondering

I have been very intrigued by the recent news cycle surrounding Nick Sandmann, a Covington (Kentucky) high school student and Nathan Phillips, a Native American Elder, that took place on the steps in front of the Lincoln Memorial on the evening of January 19, 2019.

The first video, that went viral, was of Mr. Phillips chanting and beating a drum while Mr. Sandmann stood in front of him, smiling (video can be viewed at: https://preview.msn.com/en-us/video/animals/native-americans-mocked-by-teens-in-maga-hats-at-lincoln-memorial/vp-BBSthBj). There were numerous reactions posted online in response to this particular video, including accusations of racism and hatred against Mr. Sandmann. I admit, I had my own strong, emotional reaction to what I viewed on the screen.

Subsequently, a longer video was released showing a larger context of the first video, that included a verbal confrontation between a religious group and Mr. Sandmann's high school group. It was in the midst of this confrontation that Mr. Phillips eventually approached Mr. Sandmann and the scene from the first video occurred (video can be viewed at: https://www.youtube.com/watch? time continue=1&v=t3EC1 gcr34).

Since that time, numerous people and groups have deleted and retracted their initial responses. I have observed with curiosity the ways others have responded: blaming Mr. Sandmann because of his red "Make America Great Again" hat and his pro-life stance with others blaming Mr. Phillips for creating the scene. I have even reflected on my own reactions and found something curious: On the weekend that we as a nation set aside time to celebrate the work of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., who cast a vision of people being judged by the content of their character, the news cycle and subsequent responses communicated there is still significant work to do; that I still have work to do.

I am reminded of the exhortation in the book of James: "be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to grow angry" (James 1:19, CEB). This seems like unusually practical advice for followers of Jesus Christ in the midst of our heightened and volatile political climate we find ourselves in.

"God, help me to be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to grow angry. Amen."

At our last Session meeting, it was brought to our attention that nowhere in the last newsletter did we actually say what happened on December 23<sup>rd</sup> and for that we apologize. For those who still may not know, the fire department was called by a neighbor who noticed smoke billowing out of the newer sanctuary around 7:15 pm. The sanctuary has suffered major damage and will need extensive repairing/rebuilding. This of course has been quite a shock to everyone.

Whenever something of this magnitude strikes there is an uneasy tension between expressions of grief and hope for an opportunity to do something new. As was said at our Town Hall meeting shortly after the fire, each of us responds to and processes tragedy differently. Our responsibility then, as a church family, is to honor each person's process with grace. As one of your pastors, I want to express my sorrow for those of you experiencing loss.

As followers of Christ, we believe in redemption, hope, and new beginnings for people's lives. And we can apply those same principles to Magnolia's future ministry, mission, and yes, even the rebuilding of our sanctuary. The Jeremiah scripture above was shared at our last Session meeting by one of our Elders and longtime members and is a verse that speaks of hope in the midst. May we all find comfort and give glory to God who is able to do far beyond all that we could ask or imagine by his power at work " $F_{OP}$

#### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS - February 2019**

In just under a two week period, December 24, 2018-January 6, 2019, your Session had three Called meetings. Called Meetings are special meetings for specific purposes.

After the fire of the 23<sup>rd</sup>, there were pressing decisions needing Session approval and updates to

be given, and so they met. Immediate needs were approved: holding the Christmas Eve and all future services in Fellowship Hall until the sanctuary space can be used again; and installation of the chain link fence for safety. Additionally, Elders approved the designations of a contact person (Pastor Paul) to the insurance company; and a media spokesperson (Elder Ann Laudermilk). The service of Wholeness and Healing, was approved. And in true Presbyterian fashion, sub-committees were

renewal

formed. One, to obtain a source for and purchase chairs for Fellowship Hall with a designated dollar amount already donated for this need. And two, a sub-committee authorized to obtain and contract with vendors for three phases of work: inventory and storage; demolition; and rebuild and repair. This committee was also given the approval to request an advance payment from the insurance company for the purpose of keeping Magnolia up and running.

Yes, this all seems very business-like, and this is the responsibility of the Ordered Ministry of Ruling Elder. However, at the December 24<sup>th</sup> meeting, hours before they would gather again to celebrate our Savior's birth, your Elders were asked to share words that reflected their thoughts: Hope, Opportunity, Connectiveness to Community, and Strength. As Timm High closed in prayer, he reminded us that in biblical times, fire could be destructive, but also a time of renewal. And it is with that in mind, your Session will face this year.

"I will baptize you with water. But one more powerful than I will come, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire". Luke 3:16
